New Application Procedures

As the Office of Admissions moves toward digital imaging, or paperless application review, it will not affect the holistic approach we use when reviewing our applications. Digital imaging will only increase our efficiency while saving environmental resources. We ask that you help us transition into our new paperless application review season by noting the following:

- **We will no longer accept SAT/ACT scores on high school transcripts.** Please have your students submit official test scores to our office electronically from the Collegeboard or ACT.
- **We request one letter of recommendation to make a student's application complete.** Our preference is that the recommendation be from a guidance counselor or a subject matter teacher.
- **Do not send clinical documentation of a disability to the Admissions Office.** It may be sent to Disability Services for Students, 118 Memorial Union Building, Durham, NH 03824.
- **NH Students** interested in being considered for the Governor's Success Scholarship must apply by the Early Action deadline of November 15.
- Encourage your students not to submit newspaper articles, CD's, DVD's, or other similar materials.
- Avoid staples whenever you can. Before each application is scanned, all staples must be removed. Please help us save time (and your resources) by not using staples.
- Students should write their name on every sheet of paper they submit.

NEW ON CAMPUS HOUSING OPTIONS

UNH is pleased to open two new residence halls! While not yet formally named, they are currently called the Southeast Residential Community (SERC). They will be home to 492 students

and feature 4 and 6 person suite-style housing, and some traditional double rooms. All rooms will be air conditioned with access to both main and floor lounges, laundry facilities and kitchens. By Fall 2008, a

- **NH Residents application fee is \$50**
- **Out-of-State application fee is \$65**
