NHTI Animation and Graphic Game Programming UNH Computer Science

August 2010

Introduction Faculty from the NHTI Animation and Graphic Game Programming (AGGP) program met with faculty from the UNH Computer Science (CS) program to discuss how to facilitate students moving into the UNH B.S. in Computer Science after completing the NHTI A.S. in Animation and Graphic Game Programming. Agreement was reached on how the NHTI AGGP courses will map onto the UNH CS requirements. The main goal of this document is to specify that mapping.

Grade Requirements Students must obtain an overall NHTI GPA of at least 3.0. In addition, they must obtain grades of B or better in AG 121, CP 240 and MT 205. Finally, students must have a general academic record that will allow them to be admitted to UNH.

Remaining UNH CS Requirements Once students are at UNH they will have 82 credits to complete: 42 in Computer Science, 12 in Mathematics, 8 in Science, 8 in Computer Engineering, and 12 in Liberal Arts. This will take a minimum of five semesters. To lighten the load in the first semester at UNH, students should consider taking MT 206 prior to leaving NHTI or Math 426 at UNH in the summer before starting full-time at UNH. Similarly, additional Liberal Arts or Science courses might be taken prior to leaving NHTI or during the summer at UNH. (Students must be aware that a maximum of 64 credits can be transferred into UNH, however.)

Publicizing This Agreement After this agreement has been approved by the appropriate bodies on both campuses, this agreement should be publicized on the websites of both NHTI AGGP and UNH CS. In addition, NH high-school guidance departments should be informed.

Periodic Review Faculty from NHTI AGGP and UNH CS should meet every other summer (beginning in Summer 2012) to review the cases of students who have transferred and to modify the details of this agreement as needed when the curricula on either side evolves.
