

Advanced Standing & Transfer Credit

International baccalaureate

Students earn **8 semester hours of credit** for each Higher Level (HL) exam with a score of **5, 6, or 7**. Credit is **not** awarded for:

- Standard Level (SL) exams
- Higher Level Art/Design/Film
- Business/Management

A-level examinations

Students earn **8 semester hours of credit** for A-Level exam results of **A, B, or C**. Credit is not awarded for AS or O-Level examinations.

CLEP examinations

UNH awards credit for select CLEP (college level examination program) exams when an equivalent college course has not already been completed. See the full CLEP policy and course equivalencies online. CLEP credit is limited to:

- **64 credits** toward a bachelor's degree
- **48 credits** toward an associate degree

Receiving your credit evaluation

Submit official transcripts and exam scores to the UNH Office of Admissions (CEEB Code: 3918). After admission, your evaluation will be available in DegreeWorks through MyUNH and shared with your academic advisor, dean, and the Registrar's Office. Academic departments determine how transfer credits apply to major requirements.

College course

UNH may award transfer credit for courses completed through Dual Enrollment, Running Start, Early College, another accredited college/university or an official ACE transcript when:

- The institution is regionally accredited
- A grade of C- or higher was earned
- The course is college-level (not remedial)
- The course does not duplicate high school-level Algebra or below

World language

Depending on a student's prior language study and the level of the coursework, transfer credits may be considered to fulfill the Bachelor of Arts World Language Proficiency Requirement (FLAN) or may count as general elective credit toward the total credits required for the degree program. Intermediate-level courses (or higher), or introductory courses in a new language, may also satisfy the FLAN requirements. For an unofficial review of course equivalencies use UNH's Transfer Credit Database.

Transfer credit limits

A bachelor's degree requires a minimum of **128 semester hours** for graduation. Students may transfer up to:

- **48 semester hours** toward an associate degree
- **96 semester hours** toward a bachelor's degree
- Up to **72 semester hours** may come from a community college
- Additional limitations apply to CLEP credit
