**NEW ENGLAND REGIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM**

The University of New Hampshire participates in the New England Board of Higher Education's New England Regional Student Program (NERSP). Under this program, New England residents may apply to UNH for a specific major covered under the NERSP and pay a reduced tuition rate upon admission. If you change your major to a non-NERSP program before receiving your degree, you will be required to pay the regular out-of-state tuition. The NERSP tuition rate is subject to change at any time. Currently, our NERSP rate is 175% of our in-state tuition.

## NEW ENGLAND REGIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM ESTIMATED 2018-2019 TUITION AND TOTAL EXPENSES

TUITION	\$26,495
MANDATORY FEES	\$3,359
ROOM & BOARD (Based on double occupancy room and core meal plan)	\$11,580
TOTAL DIRECT EXPENSES	\$41,434

In figuring the total cost of attending UNH, we encourage students and families to add factors such as books, supplies, transportation, and miscellaneous expenses. We estimate these annual costs to be approximately \$4,900, although it can vary per student.

The 2018-2019 estimated out of state tuition, mandatory fees, and room & board total direct expenses is \$41,434.
